Tokyo Marathon 2021 Important Updates

We would like to inform you that the Tokyo Marathon Foundation has made the 1st Go/No-Go decision for the event, and along, has decided on the following guidelines at the ad hoc Board of Directors Meeting for the 2021 event.

Entry to the event will be open from March 22 (Mon.) until March 31 (Wed.), 2021.

Furthermore, for the first time ever, in conjunction with Tokyo Marathon 2021 (Sunday, October 17, 2021), we will hold the Virtual Tokyo Marathon 2021 (tentatively named), in which people around the world can compete using a running app. Details will be separately announced once they are finalized.

Competition Rules

The races will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of the World Athletics, JAAF and the Race Organizer.

World Athletics Road Race Label Regulations also applies to the Tokyo Marathon, which has been certified by the World Athletics as Elite Platinum Label. Doping control will be conducted abiding to World Athletics Anti-Doping Regulations. World Para Athletics Rules and Regulations and the competition rules of the Tokyo Marathon applies to the wheelchair marathon; doping control is conducted under World Para Athletics Anti-Doping Regulations.

Time Limits

(1) Marathon: 7 hours; Wheelchair Marathon: 2 hours and 10 minutes.

(2) 10km (10.7km) Race: 1 hour and 45 minutes; Wheelchair 10km (10.7km) race: 40 minutes.

* The time limit and the cut-off times are all base on gun (gross) time, regardless of the belonging start time.

* The cut-off time will be enforced at each checkpoint due to reasons of traffic control, security, and event operation.

* Runners who fail to pass through the checkpoint before the cut-off time will be removed from the race. Furthermore, runners who lag excessively behind the cut-off time pace may be stopped to leave the course at any time.

Eligibility

Those who fulfill the following conditions, and whose participation is approved by the organizer.

(1) Marathon: Must be at least 19 years of age on the race day.

1-1) General - Runners who can complete the race within 6 hours and 30 minutes.

1-2) Semi-Elite Athletes - Athletes who satisfy the requirements set forth by the "RUN as ONE - Tokyo Marathon 2021".

1-3) Elite Athletes - Athletes, registered with the JAAF in fiscal 2021 who satisfy the special requirements set forth by the JAAF.

Invited Athletes: National and international runners nominated by the organizer and/or the JAAF.

1-4) General Wheelchair - Participants who can complete the race within 2 hours and 10 minutes using a racing wheelchair.

1-5) Elite Wheelchair - Athletes registered with the JPA in fiscal 2021, and to be registered with the IPC in fiscal 2021. Athletes who are in the sport classes T53 – 54 of World Para Athletics Classification and has Class Status R or C. Athletes who have the following record in the tournament of the World Para Athletics certified races:

1 hour and 50 minutes or under (Men).

2 hours or under (Women).

Invited Athletes: National and international athletes nominated by the organizer and/or the JPA.

(2) 10km (10.7km) Race: Must be at least 16 years of age on the race day.

2-1) Junior & Youth - Runners between 16 and 18 years of age on the race day, who can finish the race in 1 hour 45 min. (Runners born between October 18, 2002 and October 17, 2005 are eligible).

* Age restriction will not apply to those who are entering as the Tokyo Marathon 2020 Deferred Entry.

*Including those runners who are selected separately by the Tokyo Metropolitan Government under the projects related to the Great Japan Earthquake Recovery support.

2-2) Visually Impaired - Runners aged 16 and above on the race day, capable of finishing the race within 1 hour 45 min.

2-3) Intellectually Challenged - Runners aged 16 and above on the race day, capable of finishing the race within 1 hour 45 min.

2-4) Organ Transplant Recipients - Runners aged 16 and above on the race day, capable of finishing the race within 1 hour 45 min.

2-5) Wheelchair - Participants aged 16 and above on the race day, capable of finishing the race in 40 minutes on a racing wheelchair.

*Racing wheelchair requirements are specified in the latest “Rules and Regulations” applicable to the event day set forth by the World Para Athletics.

Event Cancellation Guideline

(1) Event Cancellation Guideline

1-1. Due to the situation surrounding COVID-19 and the state of emergency declaration is announced by the government and/or event cancellation is ordered by the municipality within a month prior to the event date, the event will be cancelled.

1-2. Aside from the reason outlined above, the event is subject to cancel due to natural disaster or in a situation in which delivering a safe event is difficult.

Others

(1) Condition of refund of the entry fee shall be outlined in the Entry Regulation.

(2) Mandatory regulations and precautions for the communicable disease will be outlined within the regulations describing countermeasures against communicable disease.

Event Cancellation Guideline

- (1) Event Cancellation Guideline
 - 1-1. If the state of emergency declaration is announced by the government and/or event cancellation is ordered by the municipality within a month prior to the event date due to the situation surrounding COVID-19, the event will be cancelled.
 - 1-2. Aside from the reasons outlined above, the event will cancel due to natural disaster or in a situation in which delivering a safe event is difficult.

- (1) Condition of refund of the entry fee shall be outlined in the regulations.
- (2) Mandatory regulations and precautions for the communicable disease will be outlined within the regulations describing countermeasures against communicable disease.
- (3) The event will be held complying to all national laws and regulations.
- (4) Upon entry, consent to all of regulations set forth will be required.
- (5) Please make every effort to enter the race in the best possible health by training sufficiently prior to the event and consulting with healthcare professional.
- (6) Secondary lottery may be held for ONE TOKYO Premium Members if any entry vacancy is available.
- (7) This outlined information is set forth for the Tokyo Marathon 2021.

③ COVID-19 Countermeasures

Thorough COVID-19 countermeasures will be implemented within Tokyo Marathon 2021 (Sunday, October 17, 2021) in accordance with the Japan Association of Athletics Federations' "Guidance for Return of Road Races," etc.

Also, we have established the COVID-19 Countermeasure Committee and the COVID-19 Investigative Committee, composed of members from the race managements, medical team, administrative entities, and other related parties to examine possible countermeasures.

At present, these countermeasures are as indicated below.

Fundamental Countermeasure Policy (Core Countermeasures)

- Management of the health of runners, volunteers, staff, and other related parties.
- Avoiding the "Three Cs" (Closed spaces, Crowded places, and Close-contact settings) within operation.

◇ Health management of all runners

- Use of a health-management app.
- Body temperature check at the Packet Pick-up and on the race day at the start area.
- Deliberation on pre-COVID-19 testing to detect possible infection.

◇ Avoiding the "Three Cs" (Closed spaces, Crowded places, and Close-contact settings) within operation

- Revised the field size (downsizing to 25,000 from 38,000) to ensure social distance (1 runner per m²) at the start.
- Introducing wave starts.
- Implementing mask requirements and prevent close-range conversations.
- Reviewing and revising the methods for providing runners with water and food (use of cups with lids for hydration and individually wrapped food at designated tables).
- Removing baggage check option.
- Switching changing area/space from indoor to open-air.

We will continue to communicate with our runners, volunteers, and all personnel involved in the event to cooperate with the initiated countermeasures against the communicable disease to deliver a safe and secure event.
