The Tokyo Marathon Foundation Charity "RUN with HEART" will open applications for donations and Charity Runners for the Tokyo Marathon 2023 [Sunday, March 5, 2023] from July 11 (Mon).

Since its launch as part of the Tokyo Marathon 2011, the Tokyo Marathon Charity program has collected roughly 3.4 billion JPY in donations, which are being used by the official charity programs. In the Tokyo Marathon 2023, 34 official charity programs will be actively carrying out their own promotional efforts, directly seeking donations.

[Tokyo Marathon Sports Legacy Program]

Through the four keywords and concepts of "Sports Dream (Enhancement and Education)," "Sports Foundation (Facilities)," "Sports Expansion (Awareness)," and "The Power of Sports (Contributing to Society)," the Tokyo Marathon Foundation Sports Legacy Program aims to create a society in which everyone can enjoy new lifestyles centered around sports, and to pass this society on to future generations. Donations are used for various activities, including the Diamond Athlete Program, a program by the Japan Association of Athletics Federations that seeks to develop and enhance the next generation of athletes, and the Para Athletics Challenge Support "EDORIKU Wheelchair Racing Workshop", organized by Edogawa City, Tokyo. In March 2022, the Sports Legacy Program has introduced new programs, "Athletics Event Continuity Support," "Diverse and Inclusive Societal Development Support," and "Athletes Activity Support." With all these initiatives, the Program continues to offer support for every aspect of sports.

"Ronald McDonald House" supports children with intractable diseases and their families through contributions and the efforts of local volunteers based on the concept of a "comfortable home away from home."
