# Tokyo Marathon 2025 Art Project Implementation Details Decided! We will be collaborating with Tokyo University of the Arts and other specialists in the art world

Last year, we held a Drawing Runner Exhibition, displaying croquis by students (artists) of the Tokyo University of the Arts that depicted the runners as they started the race and the atmosphere of the venue during the Tokyo Marathon 2024. Starting with this initiative, we launched the Tokyo Marathon Foundation Art Project, which explores the possibilities of art and sports.

For this year's race, we are planning new projects such as making support goods from waste and recycled materials, as well as art production by Tokyo University of the Arts student runners. We are working towards the realization of a community well-being society. Through the combination of Art x Sports, as well as involving various people, things and events, we will appeal to young people and create opportunities for children to become interested in sports and more. And by collaborating with experts in the varied fields of art, creation and technology, together we will gaze at a new generation as we develop together dynamically. Be sure to stay tuned.

#### Art Project Implementation Details

### Drawing Runner Exhibition —Art x Speed: Imagination against the clock!— others

With a time limit of just 30 minutes, the Tokyo University of Arts students will draw croquis of the runners as they set off from in front of the Tokyo Metropolitan Government Building, and their work will be part of an exhibit. The art students will strive to capture the physical and mental dynamism of the early moments as the runners begin their 42.195 km race using only their concentration and imagination.

This Drawing Runner Exhibition was conceived as a way to create an opportunity to combine art and sports during a conversation between our foundation's Chairman Hayano and Tokyo University of the Arts President Katsuhiko Hibino as part of the official program for the Tokyo Marathon 2024.

We are excited to see how the atmosphere of the race and the runners can be expressed through art, and what new artworks will emerge from drawing with a sports-like sensibility within the limited time frame.
